A Summer in Delta is a Beautiful Experience!

Surrounded on three sides by water and only 30 minutes away from downtown Vancouver and the many events that occur in the summer, Delta's scenic beaches, natural environment and convenient location make it a perfect place for an English Immersion summer camp program.

Three-Week Programs

- One program will run in July and one will run in August
- Individuals or groups welcome
- Ages 10 to 17 years old
- First two weeks are full day English with authentic reading, writing, speaking and listening instruction around a theme
- Last week is morning English with afternoon sightseeing and cultural activities
- Language testing occurs on the first day and students are placed in classes according to age and English level
- All students receive a certificate and report card
